**Meeting Items**

Measurement Discussion

Subcommittee chair Kayla Rose led the general review of all proposed measures to begin compiling a list of proposed measures for the core measures set. The group reviewed the remaining measures (those that scored lowest on the rubric) that were not covered in the last meeting and had additional discussion on selected measures from the last meeting. A new measure to HEIDS 2018, Pneumococcal Vaccination Coverage for Older Adults, was discussed. The group also agreed to replace the originally considered tobacco screening measure, a survey measure, with NQF #41, a PCPI measure.

After all measures had been thoroughly discussed, Kayla began leading the group through the measure selection process. The average score for the measures up for consideration was 10.4. The group agreed to not include any measures with a score of less than 10.4 in the recommended measures set, although they could be considered for future areas of development. As they went through the measures, the group decided for each measure whether to include on core measures set, remove from measures set, or to keep on a "future areas of development" list.

By the end of the meeting, the group categorized all but seven measures. Three measures were chosen for inclusion in the list of core measures, two measures were chosen for the "future areas of development" list, and 14 measures were removed from consideration. The group will evaluate the remaining seven measures at the next meeting.

The recommended list of measures is as follows:

Two measures were added to a “future considerations” list as areas to work towards in the future. The measures on this list either had data collection issues, measure methodology issues, or additional testing needed to be included on the core measures set. The recommended list of future areas of development are as follows:

The group also reviewed other measures that it chose to ultimately not include in the core measures set recommendation list. These measures (except for Fall Risk Management) fell below the average score of 10.3. The group looked at each measure but did not decide to move any of them into the recommended category. Many of the measures were patient survey questions, which the group agree not to include in the measures set. The removed measures list is as follows:

The group will review the final seven measures and finalize the recommended Preventive measures set:

- Chlamydia Screening in Women
  - Leaning towards recommending
- Flu Vaccinations for Adults Ages 18 and Older (NQF #41)
  - Replaced the prior survey
- Tobacco Screening and Cessation Intervention
- Body Mass Index (BMI) Screening and Follow-Up
- Use of High-Risk Medications in the Elderly (DAE)
  - Would be captured in the Care for Older Adults Medication Review measure (below)
- Care for Older Adults Medication Review
  - Questions about capturing data
  - Kayla mentioned it as a possible “future” measure
  - Brent McKune suggested [NQF #419](#) as a possible alternative
- Non-recommended Cervical Cancer Screening in Adolescent Females
