Meeting Items

Introductions

Each attendee introduced themselves to the group.

Current Measures Reviews

The group reviewed the results of the rubric scoring submitted by subcommittee members for the measures currently on the KY Core Healthcare Measures Set:

- Screening for Clinical Depression and Follow Up Plan (NQF #418)
- Tobacco Use: Screening and Cessation Intervention (NQF #28)
- Antidepressant Medication Management (NQF #105)
- Use of Opioids at High Dosage
- Use of Opioids from Multiple Providers

The group voted to recommend to the Oversight Committee that the five current measures remain on the KY Core Healthcare Measures Set (KCHMS).

Measures Review for Potential Addition

The group reviewed the two measures up for potential inclusion on the KCHMS.

The group voted to recommend Depression Response at Twelve Months – Progress Towards Remission to the Oversight Committee for inclusion on the KCHMS. The group voted to NOT recommend Follow-Up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness.

The discussion for each measure was as follows:

- Depression Response at Twelve Months – Progress Towards Remission (NQF #1885)
 - Although any measures that look at outcomes will be challenging to collect data for, outcomes for depression are very important, and this is a stretch measure worth picking despite the challenges
 - This is the second year that the subcommittee chose this measure
- Follow-Up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness (NQF #576)
 - Low volume and data flow are both challenges for this measure. Most practice locations won't have enough volume on this measure.

Future areas of Development

Subcommittee members discussed areas of future development in behavioral health performance measurement, including:

- Trauma screening in pediatric patients
- Adolescent suicide prevention
- Resource analysis and connectivity – do we have enough behavioral health providers to support primary care efforts

Measures Recommendation Discussion

Stephanie explained the next steps for the committee, including sending out a summary of decisions and rationale for the group to review ahead of the July 23 Oversight Committee Meeting.
