COVID-19 Testing: Moving from the Wild, Wild West to Evidence-Driven Approaches

Testing is a critical component of a public health response to an infectious disease outbreak. When it comes to the COVID-19 pandemic, there has been widespread public confusion on testing technologies and procedures. Which diagnostic test is most reliable? Who is providing tests? Is there a shortage of testing available? As we enter a new phase of reopening in this pandemic, it is critical that healthcare stakeholders have answers to these key questions, among more.
