



Paula Bates, PhD

Professor of Medicine | University of Louisville
Co-Director | KYNETIC (an NIH REACH hub)
Fellow | National Academy of Inventors

Paula J. Bates is a Professor of Medicine at the University of Louisville and the James Graham Brown Cancer Center. She also co-directs the Kentucky Network for innovation & Commercialization (KYNETIC), which is a statewide program that helps academic researchers turn their health-related discoveries or ideas into real-world products. KYNETIC provides research grants, entrepreneurial education, mentoring, and access to a network of relevant expertise; these opportunities are open to all faculty, staff, and students at Kentucky's public universities and community colleges. Bates was involved in the discovery and bench-to-bedside translation of AS1411, an aptamer (a synthetic DNA) that binds specifically to a cancer-associated protein called nucleolin. She co-founded a Louisville-based biotechnology company named Aptamera to develop AS1411, which culminated in it becoming the first anticancer aptamer to enter human clinical trials. Bates is a co-inventor on 14 issued US patents and more than 30 foreign patents. She was elected as Fellow of the National Academy of Inventors in 2016.



Ruth Carrico, PhD, DNP, APRN, FNP-C, FSHEA, CIC

Professor | Division of Infectious Diseases, University of Louisville
Editor-in-Chief | Journal of Refugee and Global Health

Ruth Carrico is a Professor and Family Nurse Practitioner with the University of Louisville School of Medicine, Division of Infectious Diseases, and director of epidemiological research in the University's Center of Excellence for Research in Infectious Diseases (CERID). Dr. Carrico has received training specific for healthcare epidemiology at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in conjunction with the Rollins School of Public Health at Emory University in Atlanta and the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America (SHEA).

Dr. Carrico is responsible for the clinical and research operations at the University of Louisville Vaccine and International Travel clinic. Her research has been funded by the CDC, HRSA, DHS, and industry.

In 2008, Dr. Carrico was appointed to the National Biosurveillance Subcommittee (NBS) Advisory Committee to the Director, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and in 2010 became a SHEA Fellow. In 2011, Dr. Carrico was appointed by Secretary Sebelius, to the Healthcare Infection Control Practices Advisory Committee (HICPAC) for an extended three-year term. In 2012, she was presented with the Carole DeMille Achievement Award by APIC, an honor for an Infection Preventionist. In 2013, Dr. Carrico was appointed to the National Foundation for Infectious Diseases as the Board's Nurse Planner and in 2014 became a Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Executive Nurse Fellow alumna. Dr. Carrico served as the 2016 president of the Certification Board of Infection Control and Epidemiology, Inc. (CBIC), the organization responsible for board certification for infection preventionists worldwide and is now enjoying the role of immediate past president. In 2016, Dr. Carrico co-founded the Infection Prevention Institute a virtual training site focusing on infection prevention education for all partners concerned with preventing infection in any setting. Then, in 2017, the University of Louisville's Journal of Refugee and Global Health was launched, with the first issue

to be released in April. Dr. Carrico serves as the Editor-in-Chief for this new open access journal. In 2018, Dr. Carrico assumed the position of president of the Kentucky Nurses Association and in 2020 was recognized as a Distinguished Fellow in the National Academy of Practices.

Stephanie Clouser is the data scientist for Kentuckiana Health Collaborative, a non-profit organization that works with key healthcare stakeholders in the community for better health outcomes and delivery in Louisville, Southern Indiana and Kentucky. 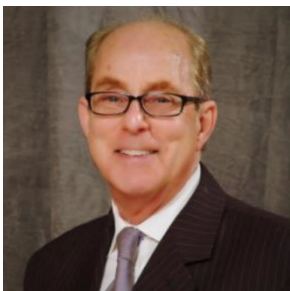


DeAnna Hall, RN
